-- won the Award of Excellence this past weekend at the 2011 Helen Keller Fine Art Festival, Tuscumbia Alabama June 23 - 26;

-- was interviewed by Tennessee Home & Farm for an upcoming issue.

-- was recently featured on News Channel 3, a live interview that included showing varied pieces of her work, including the ornaments she made for the National Tree Lighting Ceremony in Washington. She was the Tennessee artist picked (last year) to make 26 ornament--25 for the Tennessee tree and one for the White House Visitor Center's tree.

because I knew that by fusing fine silver (stars) on red glass (which has gold in its chemistry) that a chemical reaction would happen. This caused a lovely shading to occur around the stars that gave them depth. The landscapes were made to represent the lovely rolling hills and rivers of Tenn. Both ornaments are encircled by a green glass wreath that was made from recycled glass. (I asked my husband to saw rings from champagne bottles for me to fuse). I made the wreaths for several reasons: 1. This gave the ornaments a holiday touch (part of my assignment); 2. champagne is celebratory; 3. most importantly--I wanted to make the statement that Tennessee is a green state in more ways than one. We are environmentally conscious as well as beautiful."

Lee was a longtime, dedicated member of Foothills Craft Guild and active in the Norris art community as well. Her kiln was fired no more than 5 times, is approximately 6 years old, and is in extremely good condition.

Specifications: Paragon Dragon 24 front load electric kiln with Sentry electronic controls and vent unit. 208 volt, single phase, NEMA direct wire. Kiln weighs 885 lbs.
